KNOW YOUR PRESIDENT

A fter more than 20 years as a member of HPTC Cec Gardiner's commitment to the Club and passion for tennis are as strong as ever. Off the court he has already proved his organisational ability, particularly during his earlier period of club captaincy, while as a player could be fairly described as fiercely competitive (he has the unique ability to intimidate his partners and opponents to an equal extent).

A truly W.A product, Cec was born in Bunbury but had the rare distinction of spending his first year of primary schooling at the exotic location of Rawlinna. The family then moved to Perth and the remainder of his education was spread over Nedlands Primary, Scotch College and Perth Modern School. He achieved his boyhood ambition to become a primary school teacher after qualifying through UWA and Claremont Teachers College. It was at the latter institution that he first met the attractive Pam Small. The fortuitous posting of both Pam and Cec to Kalgoorlie after graduation led to wedding bells 2 years later.

Cec's teaching career subsequently took him to Bruce Rock (5 years) Manning Primary and then back to Kalgoorlie for a year before returning to the city in 1970. In 1974 he made a professional change, electing to enter the field of teacher training. His lecturing career commenced at the scene of his student days, Claremont Teachers College and progressed through to the Mt. Lawley Campus of Ratch Cowan University from which he retired in 1997.

From an early age, Cec displayed an intense interest in, and talent for, a wide range of sporting activities. At junior level he showed promise in the traditional sports of tennis, cricket and football (Aust. Rules). As a 15 year old member of Nedlands Tennis Club he filled in for the A grade pennant team on several occasions. The following year, cricket predominated, and once again he found himself promoted to the A Grade. He twice opened the batting for Nedlands senior team and had to weather the bowling of W.A's prominent shield players, Ron Gant and Keith Slater. With a top career average of less than one he decided to return to tennis.

Cec's football achievements with Claremont underage teams and later Teachers Training College side in the A division of the Amateur Association led to selection with the Claremont league side at the end of the 1956 season. He was posted to Kalgoorlie in 1957.

What may surprise most club members, however, is that Cec claimed two State boxing titles as a young teenage member of the Police Boy's Club, one at "atom" weight, the other at "paper" weight. Probably the highlight of an illustrious boxing career though was his challenge fight against "Kid Chocolate" in a boxing booth at the Royal Show during his final year at school. By surviving the compulsory 3 rounds the tall, skinny 17 year old Cecil Gardiner netted the princely sun shillings and 9 pence.

In his early adult years he continued to play football at both Kalgoorlie and Bruce Rock, later adding basketball, badminton and table tennis to his array of sporting activities. On the other hand, he faded out of the tennis scene during this period - apart from a few forays into Country Week Championships while at Bruce Rock - resuming the game after being enticed to join Hensman in 1975. Since then he, has more than made up for lost time, establishing an impressive competitive record, especially in veteran circles, and as an active contributor to the club in every sense.

As a footnote it should be added that, while tennis is now his main participative sport his passion for football, more correctly for Claremont Football Club - remains unabated. His reputation as a spectator is legendary and it is reported that he has been awarded the unofficial prize as umpire critic on each of the past 29 years he has been back in Perth.

TENNIS TIPS

Playing in the wind: If the wind is behind you, take the ball early because the wind will be holding the ball away from you. It will also carry your shots

deper, so aim a little lower per the net and you may also put some topspin on the ball to make it drop a little faster into your opponents court. When serving don't toss the ball as high, and again apply topspin to increase the amount of control.



Playing against the wind: Conditions are reversed here, so hit your ground shots higher over the net than normal. Spin is not necessary as you can hit the ball flatter and higher. When serving take off some of your normal spin and hit it flatter so that it doesn't drop too soon and give your opponent an easy return.
