With your continuing support we can look towards the 1998/99 season with confidence as Hensman Park is a very sound Club and has much to offer.



GROUNDS & HALL REPORT -

Arnold Jones

If you are wondering what on earth is happening to your grass tennis courts — do not get too alarmed!!

Two bays have been verdicut. The middle bay twice and the north bay (5 courts) three times. This is to get rid of all the excess grass and root build up over the last two years to aerate the ground and allow better penetration of the water and fertiliser.

Hopefully we will see the benefit this season with courts that have a more even bounce and harder surface. The south bay is to be verdicut in September when the grass starts to grow rapidly again.

All courts should be ready for Opening Day!

We have a new boom spray unit which will make it considerably easier to control winter weeds and prevent any spread of Winter Dead Spot and Dollar Spot that was prevalent last year.

It's been an expensive year for the Club, as in April the reticulation bore 'packed up' and had to be completely replaced. This, plus a major pump overhaul was very costly (\$4,580) but it appears at least 15 years since the original one was put down. Hopefully, it will be at least 20 years before this will recur.


With different mowing, fertilising and management techniques, I am hoping that the standard of grass tennis courts will be much better in the 1998-99 Season.
